

The challenge

Address the gaps on awareness and knowledge about the economic impacts of land degradation and the value of productive land

The need to argue the case for making the economics of land degradation an integral part of policy strategies and decision-making













A global initiative for sustainable land management

The response

- A Partnership meeting on the "Economics of Desertification, Land Degradation and Drought (E-DLDD)" in December 2010 in Bonn, Germany
- Results:
 - Outspoken support and call for a global initiative
 - First analysis by IFPRI/ZEF
 - Establishment of the ELD Secretariat
 - ELD Joint Partnership











A global initiative for sustainable land management

The response

- "Economics of Land Degradation-ELD" is a
 global initiative on the base of an economic study, to create a
 framework to measure the economic costs of land degradation and
 eventually greater awareness for the pressing issue of land degradation.
- The first core partnership: a solid political foundation.

On 20 September 2011, the *Economics of Land Degradation Initiative*was **officially launched**during the ELD Side Event of the United Nations General
Assembly High-Level Meeting on Desertification.











A global initiative for sustainable land management

The Scope

- Cover the problem of land degradation worldwide, including desertification, and drought
- Demonstrate economic consequences of land degradation and the added economic value of better sustainable land management.















A global initiative for sustainable land management

An inclusive Partnership

- Besides engaging partners from the poitical decision-making process, ELD initiative seeks cooperation with NGOs, international businesses, finance institutions, farmers and agricultural associations, universities and research institutions.
- ELD calls on scientists in different disciplines, economists and experts from the world of business to become involved.
- Cooperation with GM and the OSLO group and its partners to create synergies and a joint approach for the further process.

Next steps: Further facilitation of a relevant **scientific discourse** while simultaneously promoting the issue through the ELD **partnership structure**.

Target groups

 ELD initiative serves decision makers form both policy on all levels and the private sector

Outputs

- Global Study on the Economics of Land Degradation
- well-informed risk assessment strategies
- a long-term, proactive view of environmental change processes
- policy advice and communication strategy.









A global initiative for sustainable land management

Objectives:

Overall project approach follows Stern Review on the Economics of Climate Change and The Economics of Ecosystems and Biodiversity (TEEB), by putting a figure on the social and economic costs.

The economic side of land degradation must become an **integral part of policy-making – locally, nationally and internationally.**

ELD thus will consider institutional and political arrangements as well.
